Highlights from the Board's October 2nd Meeting via Zoom

Treasurer's Report

The BMA accounts currently hold a balance of \$14,680. The BMA decided to cancel the reservation at the Holland Center for the November town hall, opting instead to conduct the member meeting via Zoom.

Status of Recent Advisory Recommendations to Management

Upgrades to club communications, which were previously discussed with management and

requested, are set to be implemented in November. These changes aim to reduce advertising and provide more useful information. In addition, suggested website updates are also underway. It was also suggested that the club consider using text messages in addition to emails to notify members of course conditions.

Several other BMAC recommendations were presented to David Benham for consideration. These will be reported on at the Town Hall in November.

November Town Hall Plans

The upcoming town hall was postponed from November 7th to November 14th via Zoom. Zoom accommodates more attendees than the Holland Center. The proposed agenda for the town hall was discussed. It will include a treasurer's report, an update on the upcoming season's social calendar, a review of what has been done around the club during the summer, and an update on the lawsuit.

Club Utilization and Member Engagement

David Benham requested recommendations from BMAC regarding strategies to motivate members to participate in social and dining events. BMAC had a long and healthy discussion, and a report is being prepared to submit to management.

Support for Foothill's Food Bank

A food donation drive initiated by the Mulligans, has garnered support from BMAC, all of the golf, tennis, and pickleball associations, and even the Boulders HOAs. Donations of non-perishable items will be collected at the clubhouse December 9th and 10th and delivered to the Foothills Food Bank. The event is timed to coincide with members cleaning out their pantries before leaving for the holidays. It will be repeated at the end of April. Checks made out to the Foothills Food Bank are also welcome. More details will be communicated in the coming weeks.

Linda Garner, reported that the BWGA plans to promote the Foothills Food Bank "Good Neighbor" program again this year. This is the new name for their annual Adopt a Family initiative, supported by the BWGA and many Boulders Members for many years. The BWGA's December 9th game will be themed around these donations.

Golf and Greens Committees

The Committee members are anxiously awaiting the opening of the North Course next week. Pickleball and Tennis Committee

Kevin Chapman reported that the two tennis associations have agreed to a minor edit needed to align their bylaws, and both sets of bylaws will be sent to the board for approval.
